Dear Helmetta Pet Owner,

State law requires all dog and cat licenses to be renewed every year. Your current license expires on December 31, 2023, no matter when you received it. All dogs and cats that are six (6) months of age or older, residing in the Borough of Helmetta, are required to be licensed.

**Dog/cat license fees:**

Paid by	Spayed/Neutered	Not Spayed/Neutered
January 31, 2024	\$8.00	\$11.00
February 1 - 29, 2024	\$13.00	\$16.00
March 1 - 31, 2024	\$18.00	\$21.00
After March 31, 2024	\$23.00	\$26.00

The postmark must be by January 31, 2024 if you are mailing in your application. For licenses not renewed by January 31, 2024, a summons may be issued.

You may renew your license in person, Monday through Friday at Borough Hall from 8:00am to 4:00pm. Please have the exact amount if paying by cash. You may also mail your renewal in, or you may use the drop-box by the steps on the exit side of the building. Make checks or money orders payable to "Borough of Helmetta." Please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope to receive your pet's tag, copy of license, and receipt.

When renewing your license, please provide the name of the veterinarian and the date your pet was spayed/neutered. If this is the first time you are applying for a license, you must submit the original spayed/neutered statement from the vet with your application. The clerk's office will need to see a copy of a letter attesting if your pet is a service/support animal.


Please let me know if you no longer have your pet in order to update our records.

Rabies vaccinations must expire after October 31, 2024 as per NJ State Law. If they expire before November 1 of the licensing year, you must get a new vaccination prior to receiving the license.

Our free rabies vaccination clinic will be held on Tuesday, March 26, 2024 from 6:00pm to 8:00pm at Helmetta Borough Hall.

# PET WASTE AND WATER POLLUTION



The Borough of Helmetta has adopted and enforces an ordinance that requires immediate and proper disposal of solid pet waste deposited on any property not owned or possessed by the pet owner or keeper.

Pet waste is carried by rain, melting snow, and ice to storm drains that empty into rivers, lakes, and the ocean. It also reaches reservoirs which supply much of the drinking water in New Jersey.

Pollution due to pet waste negatively impacts swimming, boating, and fishing in these water bodies.

Pet waste contains microorganisms that can cause bacterial diseases, roundworms, and parasitic infections.

In addition, pet waste contains harmful levels of nutrients which promote excessive algae and plant growth. This can rob the waterbody of oxygen, potentially killing all aquatic life in the area. Such nutrient pollution also causes waters to become cloudy and green.

## Proper Pet Waste Disposal

Flush it down the toilet.

\*But do not flush bags, debris, or nonbiodegradable items\*

Put it in the trash.
