Be it ordained by the Board of Health of the Borough of Helmetta, in the County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey:

§ 61-1. Adoption of standards.

A code regulating boarding homes for children, providing for the inspection of such establishments and fixing penalties for violations is hereby established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3-69.1 to 3-69.1.6. A copy of said code is annexed hereto and made a part hereof without the inclusion of the text thereof herein.

§ 61-2. Title.

Said code established and adopted by this chapter is described and commonly known as the "New Jersey Boarding Home for Children Code (1956)."

§ 61-3. Copies on file.

Three (3) copies of the said New Jersey Boarding Home for Children Code (1956) have been placed on file in the office of the Sanitary Inspector of this local Board of Health upon the introduction of this chapter and will remain on file there until final action is taken on this chapter for the use and examination of the public.

§ 61-4. Licenses; fees; revocation; nontransferability.

- A. No person shall operate a boarding home for children unless a license or approval of an existing license to operate the same shall have been issued by the Board of Health. Such license or approval of an existing license shall be posted in a conspicuous place in such establishment.
- B. There shall be a charge for such license or approval of an existing license based upon a fee schedule established on an annual basis by resolution of the governing body. **[Amended 12-15-83]**
- C. Licenses issued or approved under the provisions of this chapter shall expire one (1) year from the date of issuance, and application for renewal thereof shall be submitted in the form and manner prescribed by Section 2.2 of said code, together with the required fee, thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date.
- D. A license or approval of license may be suspended or revoked for violation by the holder of any provision of this chapter or code, after an opportunity for a hearing by the Board of Health or its authorized representative.

E. A license or approval of an existing license is not transferable between persons or premises.

§ 61-5. Violations and penalties.¹

Any person who violates any provision of or order promulgated under this chapter or code established herein shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty of not less than two dollars (\$2.) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) for each violation. Each day a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.
