IV. <u>DESIG</u>NATION OF DEPOSITORIES

The following banks and financial institutions are hereby designated as official depositories for the Deposit of all public funds referred to in the Plan, including any certificates of deposit which are not otherwise invested in Permitted Investments as provided for in this Plan:

PNC Bank New Jersey Cash Management Fund TD Bank Wachovia

All such depositories shall acknowledge in writing receipt of this Plan by sending a copy of such acknowledgement to the Designated Official referred to in Section III above.

V. <u>DESIGNATION OF BROKERAGE FIRMS AND DEALERS WITH</u> WHOM THE DESIGNATED OFFICIALS MAY DEAL

The following firms and/or dealers and other institutions are hereby designated as firms with whom the Designated Official of the Borough of Helmetta referred to in this Plan may deal for purposes of buying and selling securities identified in this Plan as Permitted Investments or otherwise providing for Deposits. All such brokerage firms and/or dealers shall acknowledge in writing receipt of this Plan by sending a copy of such acknowledgement to the Designated Official referred to in Section III above.

VI. <u>AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS</u>

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Designated Official is hereby authorized to invest the public funds covered by this Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in Deposits, in the following Permitted Investments:
 - 1) Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America;
 - 2) Government money market mutual funds;

- 3) Any obligations that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factor;
- 4) Bonds or other obligations of the Local Unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the Local Unit is a part or within the school district is located;
- 5) Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, approved by the Division of Investments of the Department of the Treasury for Investments by Local Units;
- 6) Local government investment pools;
- 7) Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to section 1 of P.L. 1977, c.281(c.52:18A-90.4); or
- 8) Agreements for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if:
 - a) the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (3) of this subsection a;
 - b) the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party;
 - c) the maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days;
 - d) the underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in section 1 of P.L. 1970,c.236(C.17:9-41); and
 - e) A master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

For purposes of the above language, the terms "government money market mutual fund" and "local government investment pool" shall have the following definitions:

Government Money Market Mutual Fund. An investment company or investment trust:

- a) which is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the "Investment Company Act of 1940", 15 U.S.C. sec.80a-1 et seq., and operated in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec.270.2a-7.
- b) The portfolio of which is limited to US Government securities that meet the definition of any eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec.270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such US Government securities; and
- c) Which has:
 - (i) attained the higher ranking or the highest letter and numerical rating of a nationally recognized statistical rating organization; or

(ii) Retained an investment advisor registered or exempt from registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the "Investment Advisors Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec.80b-1 et seq., with experience investing in US Government securities for at least the most recent past 60 months and with assets under management in excess of \$500 million.

Local Government Investment Pool. An Investment pool:

- (a) which is managed in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec.270.2a-7;
- (b) which is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization;
- (c) which is limited to US Government securities that meet the definition of an eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such US Government securities;
- (d) which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act", P.L. 1968,c.410(c.52:14B-1 et seq.) by the Local Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;
- (e) which does not permit investments in instruments that are subject to high price volatility with changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and
- (f) which purchases and redeems investments directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, of the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this State, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967 c.9(C.49:3-56) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in US Government

securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such US Government securities.

B. Notwithstanding the above authorization, the moneys on hand in the following funds and accounts shall be further limited as to maturities, specific investments or otherwise as follows:

VII. SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT & ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RECEIPT OF PLAN

To the extent that any Deposit of Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Borough of Helmetta, then such instrument or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the Borough of Helmetta to assure that there is no unauthorized use of the funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments that involve securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to insure that such Permitted Investment are either received by the Borough of Helmetta or by a third party custodian prior to or upon the release of the Borough of Helmetta's funds.

To assure that all parties with whom the Borough of Helmetta deals either by way of Deposits or Permitted Investments are aware of the authority and the limits set forth in this Plan, all such parties shall be supplied with a copy of this Plan in writing and all such parties shall acknowledge the receipt of that Plan in writing, a copy of which shall be on file with the Designated Official.

VIII. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

On the first day of each month during which this Plan is in effect, the Designated Official referred to in Section III hereof shall supply to the Governing Body of the Borough of Helmetta a written report of any Deposits or Permitted Investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- A. The name of any institution holding funds of the Borough of Helmetta as a Deposit or a Permitted Investment.
- B. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month.
- C. The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made.

- D. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- E. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.
- F. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- G. The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.
- H. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the Governing Body of the Borough of Helmetta.

IX. TERM OF PLAN

This Plan shall be in effect from January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011. Attached to this Plan is a resolution of the Governing Body of the Borough of Helmetta approving this Plan for such period of time. The Plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Council, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendment to all parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.

RETURNED CHECK CHARGE

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, that any checks returned to the Borough of Helmetta, will be subject to a charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

RESOLUTION #2011 - 35 CANCELLATION OF MINIMUM BALANCES

WHEREAS, Chapter 113 of P.L.1996 allows the Tax Collector to cancel minimum balances as they occur without the requirement of the Governing Body's approval of each individual account; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to save time and paperwork for both the Governing Body and the Tax Collector by allowing the Tax Collector to cancel these balances upon occurrence instead of listing them for resolution approval.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta that the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to cancel minimum balances and credits under the amount of \$10.00 as they occur throughout the calendar year of 2011.

RESOLUTION #2011 - 36

AUTHORIZATION TO CONDUCT TAX LIEN SALE

WHEREAS, there remains on the records and books of the Borough of Helmetta delinquent taxes, water and sewer utility charges, and other municipal charges owing as of December 31, 2010; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54-5 et seq., provides for the enforcement and collection of such delinquencies through a tax lien sale; and

WHEREAS, the Tax Collector is empowered by statute to conduct and preside over the sale of liens; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:-26 has been amended to allow the Tax Collector to mail two (2) notices in lieu of two (2) newspaper advertisements in preparation for the tax lien sale and add \$25.00 per mailing to the cost of the sale (per property);

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, that the Borough of Helmetta Tax Collector be and is hereby authorized to conduct a tax lien sale for 2010 delinquent taxes, utility and other municipal charges;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tax Collector is authorized to charge \$25.00 per property mailing to the costs of the lien sale.

RESOLUTION #2011 - 37

INTEREST ON DELINQUENT TAXES

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey that in accordance with Chapter 54:4-67 of the New Jersey Statutes the interest rate on delinquent taxes shall be eight per cent (8%) annum on the first \$1500.00 of delinquency, and 18% per annum on any amount in the

excess of \$1500.00 to be calculated from the date the tax was payable until the date of actual payment. There shall be a ten (10) day grace period for payment of taxes.

RESOLUTION #2011 - 38

PENALTY FOR DELINQUENCIES OVER \$10,000.00

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54: 4- 67 has been amended to adopt into the law a provision which permits the Governing Body to fix a penalty to be charged to a taxpayer with a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 who fails to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year. The penalty so fixed shall not exceed 6% of the amount of delinquency; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Helmetta desires to adopt a penalty provision as authorized by N.J.S.A. 54:4-67,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, that the Borough of Helmetta hereby adopts and authorizes the Tax Collector of the Borough of Helmetta to assess an additional six per cent (6%) penalty to any taxpayer with a delinquency of all taxes and municipal charges due in excess of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) who fails to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year.

RESOLUTION #2011 – 39

INTEREST ON DELINQUENT WATER & SEWER PAYMENTS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta has established an interest rate in accordance with State law for unpaid water rents and sewer user charges;
