ORDINANCE # 2011 - 11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 55 ("VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC") OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HELMETTA TO APPLY TITLE 39 MOTOR VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT TO THE PRIVATE ROADS OF REGENCY WALK AND TO UPDATE THE PENALTY PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO HEATHER GLEN

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:5A-1 allows an individual person or corporation to request that a municipality apply the State of New Jersey motor vehicle laws ("Title 39") to certain private roads and streets, so that the police can enforce the State traffic laws on such streets; and

WHEREAS, Title 39 is currently enforced on the private roads, driveways and parking areas of Heather Glen condominium complex in the Borough of Helmetta (the "Borough"); and

WHEREAS, Regency Walk, a townhouse community located in the Borough, filed a written request with the Borough Clerk that the provisions of Title 39 be made applicable to the private roads, driveways and parking areas of Regency Walk; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 55 of the Code of the Borough of Helmetta governs vehicles and traffic within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to amend Chapter 55 of the Code in order to allow for Title 39 enforcement to the private roads, driveways and parking areas of Regency Walk; and

WHEREAS, the Borough also desires to amend Chapter 55 of the Code in order to update the penalty and violations which are applicable to Heather Glen; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has determined that such amendments to the Code are necessary and beneficial for the Borough and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Helmetta, County of Middlesex, and State of New Jersey that Chapter 55 of the Code, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" is hereby amended as follows (Additions are in bold type and underlined and deletions are struck-through)

1. ARTICLE XII B is amended as follows:

§ 55-27.9. Violations and penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey statute, every person convicted of a violation of this Article or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or both those prescribed by N.J.S.A. 40:49-5.

 - 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
 - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.
