Alva Nardine 10 Baker Drive asked how do they feel about their jobs. What are the feelings of the PBA.

Wendy Vidal, 8 Locust Drive said they need to be protected. Knowledge is power.

Bret Evans, 3 Avenue B asked if we are going to add additional men. The Mayor told him that at this time we only have 3 that could work by themselves.

Patrick Smith, 2A Lake Avenue said that there is room in other departments. We should make sure that we get a long term contract as the fee will change.
