Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, in the County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey:

§ 21-1. Animals at large unlawful.

No person or persons shall allow any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, goats or other animals to be tied or run at large in the public streets and public places within the corporate limits of said borough for the purpose of grazing, or shall permit any geese, ducks, chickens or other poultry to run at large through the said streets or public places within the corporate limits of said borough.

§ 21-2. Violations and penalties.¹

Each and every person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.) or be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or both.
