THIS CONTRACT entered into this 1st day of January 2026,
between the COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, a municipal corporation of the State of New
Jersey, having its principal office at 75 Bayard Street New Brunswick, New
Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY" and the BOROUGH OF HELMETTA,
having its principal office at 51 Main Street, Helmetta, in the County of Middlesex and
the State of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the "MUNICIPALITY",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has created the Middlesex County Office of Health Services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-1 *et seq.*, to provide an array of public health services; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality is desirous of contracting with the County for furnishing by the County to the Municipality health services of a technical and professional nature as more fully set forth below; and

WHEREAS, the parties to this contract are authorized to contract for said Services pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 *et seq.*;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, agreements and other considerations between the parties, the parties do hereby mutually covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. The County shall provide properly licensed personnel within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality, to carry out the following public health activities:
 - a. ADMINISTRATION
 - b. HEALTH EDUCATION

- c. COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH ACT (CEHA) ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS
- d. PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING
- e. PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTION
- f. EPIDEMIOLOGY AND BIOTERRORISM
- 2. All of the above mentioned activities shall be provided in accordance with the <u>Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of Health in New Jersey</u> as set forth at <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 8:52-1.1 *et seq.* and the regulations promulgated under the County Environmental Health Act (CEHA) <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 7:1H *et seq.*
- 3. In addition to the above public health services, the County will continue to provide specialized grant services.
- 4. In the event a particular public health service or activity exceeds the actual cost to provide said services, the Director shall have the discretion to determine whether the service or activity is necessary, shall be modified, may seek alternative funding or may engage in negotiations with the Municipality for the costs in excess of what is provided for in this Agreement.
- 5. In the event that the County or the Director seeks to exercise its rights

under Paragraph 4 hereof, determining services are necessary and seeking costs in excess of what is provided for in this Agreement, the County and/or Director shall provide written notice to the Municipality sixty (60) days in advance of any increased costs sought, at which time the Borough of Helmetta shall have the option to accept the increased costs, negotiate a mutual acceptable amount, or shall be permitted to explore and find an alternate method of delivery for said services and/or to terminate the agreement within the sixty (60) days thereof.

- 6. The term of this contract shall be for one (1) year commencing on January 1, 2026, and terminating on December 31, 2026, unless terminated earlier as provided for hereinafter.
- 7. The base cost for the provision of the aforesaid health services shall be as follows:

2026 - \$21,490.83

It is understood that the costs, as set forth above, reflects the actual cost to the County to provide the health services.

- 8. Should the Municipality utilize the early termination procedures set forth in Paragraph 12, then in that event, the Municipality shall pay to the County any increases in costs the County incurred to provide said services in the year of termination that the County was not able to mitigate. Said payment shall be made by the Municipality within thirty (30) days from the receipt from the County of a statement of such additional costs.
- 9. The Municipality shall designate during the life of this contract, the Director of the County Office of Health Services as the Health Officer of the

Municipality, who shall be its general agent for the enforcement of the local health ordinances and the laws, rules and regulations of the New Jersey Department of Health.

- 10. The Director of the County Office of Health Services shall supervise and direct all public health activities and health employees of the Municipality.
- 11. Said Director or his representative shall attend the monthly meetings of the local Board of Health and shall report to the Committee on Health of the Board of County Commissioners at least annually. Copies of said report shall be furnished to the Municipality.
- 12. This contract may be terminated by either of the parties for convenience, upon 120 days notice.
- 13. The contract shall be subject to the approval of the State Commissioner of Health.
- 14. During the period that the County Office of Health Services provides health services as set forth above, any State aid received by the Municipality for such health services shall be paid to the County of Middlesex and deducted from the actual costs of services.
- 15. The obligations of the County and Municipality are subject to the availability and appropriation of funds.
- 16. The County of Middlesex and the Municipality shall save, protect, indemnify and hold harmless each other and their respective elected officials, officers and employees from any and all damages or claims for damages to persons or property, including reasonable counsel fees and costs, which may result or arise from the actions, failure to act, negligence, and/or willful misconduct of their employees, agents or

contractors under this Agreement, to the extent permitted and pursuant to the provision of the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et. seq. and the New Jersey Contractual Liability Act, N.J.S.A. 50:13-1 et. seq.

17. This agreement and any amendments hereto, shall be subject to the formal approval by the Board of County Commissioners and the Municipal Council.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the County of Middlesex has caused this instrument to be signed by the Director of the Board of County Commissioners, attested by the Clerk of said Board, and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed pursuant to a resolution of said Board passed for that purpose and said Municipality of Helmetta caused its proper officers to execute the same, pursuant to a Resolution passed for that purpose the day and year first written above.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Treasury has ceased minting new onecent coins for circulation, and pennies in circulation remain legal tender but are increasingly scarce in banking channels, which has reduced municipal access to low-denomination coin for making change at payment counters; and

WHEREAS, there is presently no uniform federal rounding mandate, and cash-only rounding practices adopted in other jurisdictions commonly round the final cash settlement to the nearest five cents after all taxes and fees are computed, while electronic and check payments continue to the exact cent; and

WHEREAS, the Borough must continue to accept lawful payments, provide clear and fair settlement practices for in-person cash payers, and ensure that ledgered amounts for taxes, utilities, and other fees remain recorded to the exact cent as required by law and sound accounting; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council find that a customer-protective procedure is necessary to address coin scarcity, prevent overcharges, and provide consistent treatment across Borough departments until further federal or State guidance is issued;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Helmetta, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. **Scope.** This Resolution applies to in-person cash receipts handled by the Tax Collector, Utility office, Municipal Court, Clerk, Police Records, Recreation, and any other Borough cashiering points. It does not alter any fee, rate, tax, penalty, or interest established by statute, ordinance, or resolution.
- 2. Rounding rule for cash settlements only. When coin change in one-cent denominations is unavailable, the cashier shall round the final cash amount due to the nearest five cents after all calculations, including sales tax if applicable, are completed. Amounts ending in 1 or 2 cents shall round down to 0 cents. Amounts ending in 3 or 4 cents shall round up to 5 cents. Amounts ending in 6 or 7 cents shall round down to 5 cents. Amounts ending in 8 or 9 cents shall round up to 10 cents. Amounts ending in 0 or 5 cents shall not be rounded.
- 3. Ledger integrity. All Borough ledgers and account records for taxes, utilities, fees, fines, and other receivables shall continue to reflect the exact amount to the cent. Any rounding happens solely at the cash settlement stage for purposes of making change.
- 4. Credits and refunds. If rounding results in the payer tendering an amount that exceeds the exact amount due, the overage shall be automatically applied as a credit to the payer's account for the next billing cycle. Upon request at the time of payment, the payer may elect an immediate refund of the overage by check, subject to standard disbursement procedures, or may apply the overage to another Borough receivable in the payer's name.
- 5. Customer-protective treatment. For taxes, utilities, and other statutory charges, the Borough shall not require a payer to remit more than the exact amount due as a condition of timely payment. If rounding would otherwise increase the amount the payer must tender in cash, the Borough shall accept the lower rounded amount as payment in full for that

installment and post any remaining cents as a Borough-absorbed variance, or shall offer the payer the option to tender the exact-cent amount by card or check.

- 6. **Electronic and check payments.** Payments by credit card, debit card, ACH, or check shall continue to be accepted and processed at the exact-cent amount with no rounding.
- 7. Acceptance of coins presented by payers. The Borough will accept pennies presented in payment. Due to bank distribution limits, staff may be unable to provide pennies in change; the rounding procedure in Section 2 shall apply in that circumstance.
- 8. Signage and public notice. The Borough Clerk, in coordination with the CFO and Department Heads, shall post a public notice on the Borough website and social media and place signage at cashiering locations explaining the rounding procedure, the availability of exact-cent electronic and check payments, and the automatic credit or refund options for any overage.
- 9. **Staff procedures.** The CFO and Tax Collector are authorized to issue written cashiering procedures and training consistent with this Resolution, including reconciliation steps to ensure that daily cash receipts balance to ledgered exact-cent amounts and that credits or refunds are promptly recorded.
- 10. **Effective date and review.** This Resolution shall take effect December 15, 2025, and shall remain in effect until amended or repealed. The CFO shall report back to the Governing Body within six months with data and recommendations, or sooner if federal or State guidance is issued.
- 11. **Severability.** If any provision of this Resolution is found invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
- 12. **Authority.** This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the Borough's general police powers and fiscal administration authority under New Jersey law, and is intended as an administrative procedure that does not modify any rate, fee, or tax established by statute or ordinance, unless otherwise specifically amended.

- Preparing GIS maps, tables, and narrative summaries required for the Phase 1 WIP submission;
- Preparing a Watershed Inventory Report consistent with NJDEP Section H requirements;

BACKGROUND

Helmetta and all NJ municipalities have been subject to **Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System** (MS4) permits that govern operation and maintenance of municipally-owned and/or operated stormwater infrastructure, as well as ongoing development and water quality reporting responsibilities.

NJDEP is now requiring all Municipalities, as part of the 2023 MS4 Permit renewal, to develop a **Watershed Improvement Plan (WIP)** in 3 phases (I,II,III). The requirements and timetables associated with each phase are listed in **Section H**, "Watershed Improvement Plan" within the Borough's MS4 permit.

The GIS Mapping of the storm sewer infrastructure is also due by January 1, 2026. RVE is completing this mapping for the Borough prior to the 1/1/2026 NJDEP deadline. Said digital mapping must be completed for incorporation into the Phase I WIP report.

The WIP must be developed and submitted to NJDEP in three (3) phases (as stipulated in the MS4 permit):

- Phase 1: Helmetta must complete storm water inventory by mapping required features, data and to complete a Watershed Inventory Report. Initial submission Due January 1, 2026.
- Phase 2: Helmetta will evaluate the information found in the first phase to determine what potential improvement projects may be implemented to address water quality and quantity concerns. Due January 1, 2027.
- <u>Phase 3</u>: Helmetta will identify which of the potential quality and quantity improvement projects they are choosing to implement, and on what schedule. **Due December, 2027**.

Identify sub watersheds within the permittee's jurisdiction that overburdened communities are present in and summarize the importance of clean surface water in overburdened communities.
- Impervious Areas. Review data, prepare a map depicting the permittee's impervious areas, including HUC 14 boundaries within the permittee's jurisdiction, Summarize the methodology used to collect the data, including the date(s) for when data was collected and the source if taken from publicly available data, Identify the percent impervious coverage in each sub watershed within the permittee's jurisdiction and Summarize the impervious coverage effects on ecosystems and stream health.
- Location and Ownership of all stormwater infrastructure not owned or operated by the permittee. Review data, prepare a map of all privately owned infrastructure within the permittee's jurisdiction will be required. A Table will also be required which includes ID number of stormwater infrastructure, type of infrastructure, and who owns it.

SCOPE OF SERVICES (WIP Phase 1 report preparation, filing and public comment requirements)

The Phase 1 Watershed Inventory Report preparation (and public coordination) will include various GIS mapping review and analysis, data collection and reporting. RVE personnel will perform the work to produce this mapping, tables and data and summarize the findings in a report as required by NJDEP (as summarized below):

Task 1 - Compile Maps, Data and Tables for the Watershed Inventory Report

See items, above.

Task 2 – Preparation of Watershed Inventory Report

This task will involve preparing the report within the guidelines and requirements of the NJDEP.

Task 3 – Public Participation

There is a **public comment** requirement for all 3 phases. For **Phase 1**, the Borough must comply with the following public comment requirements:

- Helmetta shall solicit input from stakeholders, including residents, business owners, owners
 of private stormwater facilities and other municipalities and/or dischargers to the
 subwatershed(s) to be involved in the Plan development process.
- Helmetta shall conduct semi-annual public information sessions (in-person or virtual) beginning on or before January 1, 2026, throughout the development of the Plan. These sessions may be included as part of a regular Borough Council agenda under "Public Comment" to solicit public input (if any). At a minimum, the second (semi-annual) public information session would be held by or before July 1, 2026. RVE will be available for both public meetings to answer any questions raised by the Borough Council or the public.

Task 4 - Submission of Preliminary, Final WIP Reports to NJDEP

Services include preparation and filing of the preliminary report (by January 1, 2026) and final report (including revisions from data obtained from Borough review and public session comments), by or before July 1, 2026.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 17-2002 TO INCREASE THE LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARDS PROGRAM ("LOSAP") CONTRIBUTION FOR VOLUNTEER MEMBERS OF THE HELMETTA VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, TO UPDATE THE ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST, AND TO AUTHORIZE CPI-BASED ANNUAL ADJUSTMENTS AS PERMITTED BY STATE LAW

WHEREAS, the Borough of Helmetta previously adopted Ordinance 17–2002 establishing a Length of Service Awards Program (LOSAP) pursuant to Chapter 388 of the Laws of 1997 in order to reward volunteer members of the Helmetta Volunteer Fire Department for their loyal, diligent, and devoted service to the residents of Helmetta; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 17-2002 authorized an annual LOSAP contribution of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to each qualified volunteer firefighter meeting the eligibility criteria; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-185 authorizes increases to LOSAP contributions and provides that any increase exceeding the applicable Consumer Price Index ("CPI") must be approved by the voters at a general election; and

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2025, the Borough of Helmetta presented to the voters the following public question: "Shall the Borough of Helmetta be authorized to increase the maximum annual contribution to the Length of Service Awards Program (LOSAP) for volunteer members of the Helmetta Volunteer Fire Department from \$400.00 to \$500.00?"

WHEREAS, the voters approved the increase with 676 votes in favor and 105 votes opposed; and

WHEREAS, the Borough now seeks to amend Ordinance 17-2002 to implement the voter-approved increase, update the estimated cost of the program, and authorize annual CPI-based adjustments as permitted by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Helmetta that Ordinance 17-2002 is amended as follows:

- 1. **Annual LOSAP Contribution.** The annual contribution for each eligible volunteer member who earns at least fifty (50) points in a calendar year shall be increased from four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to five hundred dollars (\$500.00). All eligibility and certification requirements set forth in Ordinance 17-2002 shall continue to apply unless otherwise modified by law.
- 2. Estimated Program Cost. The estimated cost of the LOSAP program is increased from eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) per year to nine thousand dollars (\$9,000.00) per year.
- 3. CPI-Based Adjustments. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-185, the annual LOSAP contribution shall be automatically adjusted each year based on the Consumer Price Index ("CPI") as determined by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services. The adjusted contribution shall remain effective unless subsequently modified by ordinance or further voter approval when required.

4. Continuation of All Other Provisions. All other terms, provisions, and administrative procedures established by Ordinance 17-2002, including the point system and certification process, shall remain in full force and effect except to the extent inconsistent with this amendment or state law.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
