Mayor Slavicek read the Oath of Office to Noreen Carolan - Genthe.

Councilwoman Carolan-Genthe took her seat on the dais.

* PUBLIC PORTION

Members of the public wishing to address the Mayor and Borough Council must approach the podium and give their name and address for the record. There is a five (5) minute time limit for each person for their questions and comments.

Yvette K. Bruno, 4 Sutton Place congratulated Noreen. She chose to ask her questions and then receive the answers so she wouldn't go over her 5 minutes. She asked the following questions:

What is the status of the animal shelter?

What is the status of the lawsuit and who got served?

Will the taxes be going up?

Regarding the yard sale ordinance, she thinks we should get rid of it.

Negotiations on the Public Work contract? As a resident she thinks we should get rid of it.

The Borough Attorney stated that if it is preexisting, NJ Law prohibits it.

She doesn't think that the DPW Supervisor should be in the union or negotiating his own contract.

She listened to the tape from the last meeting and had questions on the 2% cap.

She sent an e-mail and there was not an out of office reply when someone was out, but since it has been taken care of.

She said there is a lot fixing needing to be done in town and she hopes they can fix it. If not she thinks we should have more shared services or merge with Spotswood.

Mayor Slavicek responded to her questions:

The animal shelter has been cleaned out, staged and videotaped. A three to four minute virtual tour will go out with RFP's and will be ready in a week or two. The painting was done for free. Terry was very dedicated and volunteered a lot of her time and was thanked and Mr. Zambory from Spotswood High School volunteered his services to film. (answered by Councilman Karczewski)

No one has been served. Our Attorney Mr. Youssouf asked the Clerk if she was served with papers. In the State of New Jersey the general rule is that papers should be served within ten days of filing.

We don't know the scope of the taxes. JIF will handle our lawsuits and we have to pay the deductible. Hopefully we will be successful.

The yard sale ordinance will be kept as is. We will keep an eye on it. If the Clerk is out the

Administrator will issue the permits. If no permit was obtained, the Police will not close them down.

The Public Works contract was negotiated. The Attorney said that he is not prepare to talk about it now. Yvette doesn't think the Director should be in the contract.

Councilman Perez spoke about the 2% cap. There are some constraints that exceed 2% such as health benefits which are uncontrollable expenses. It basically helps us to legally pay our bills by going over the cap. The Auditor will be at the May meeting to answer questions.

The Borough employees will be putting away messages on their e-mails when they are not here.

He has spoken to the Mayor of Spotswood about the possibility of our Seniors joining together and our children with recreation.

We have services with Sayreville for construction and their contract is up soon. She asked if we will be bringing back to Helmetta and the Mayor said the Auditor does not think it is a good idea but we are looking into it.

Yvette thanked the Mayor for always getting back to her.

There being no one else who wished to be heard, the Public Portion of the meeting was closed.
