## \* OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT STATEMENT

Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided as is required under Chapter 231 Public Law 1975 specifying the time, date, location and to the extent known the agenda by posting a copy on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building outside of the meeting room and providing a copy to the Home News Tribune and Sentinel newspapers and by filing a copy in the office of the Municipal Clerk in accordance with the certification which will be entered in the minutes of this meeting.

## \* PUBLIC PORTION

During the Public Portion of any Council Meeting members of the Public may only speak on topics of concern to the residents of the Borough. Each individual will be given five minutes to speak as per the Rules to Govern adopted January 4, 2017. During the Public potion of any meeting, the members of the Public as well as the Governing Body shall be courteous and respectful to one another. No comments and/or behavior that are considered disrespectful, ill-willed or with the intent to harass will be tolerated. If such behavior occurs, then that individual member of the Public will be asked to sit down and his or her turn to speak will be over, even if the five minutes is not.

John Nartowicz, 2 Holly Manor Court asked when the leases for the police cars will be over. Matthew Crane said there is only one and it will be up in 2018. He asked if we show revenue coming back to us from Bingo. Councilman Joe Reid, a member of the Fire, said they used it as a fund raiser to pay for building maintenance, different inspections that we have to have during the year. He asked if this is above the \$31,000.00 that is given to them. Councilman Reid said that is for the administrative side. He asked why did we give a \$15000.00 donation to the Spotswood EMS. The Mayor said it is a contribution towards our shared services with them. He also asked about the increase in radio dispatch. The Mayor said that Spotswood is now hiring full time dispatchers and not using their Police Officers as in the past. He also questioned the lights in the Community Center as to why they have to be on. Mr. Nartowicz said that only the Exit letters need to be on. The Mayor said they are hard wired and there is no switch to turn them off. Councilman Karczewski said he was told it was code. The Mayor said that they will further look into this.

John Daly, 11 York Drive complimented the Public Works gentlemen for doing such a good job on cleaning the streets. He said the town should be proud of themselves for what is being done with the old factory but why is there old photos? He commented that people are afraid to come through Helmetta, even though they do speed on Old Forge Road. The Mayor said Councilman Karczewski recently discussed this with the Police Department. He said he is not criticizing the Police as they are there. He signed up for the e-mail list and was told he would be notified about things happening in Helmetta and has not received any messages. He was asked If he signed up for Nixle and said yes but he doesn't need to know what is going on in East Brunswick in the middle of the night. The Mayor said he will look into the e-mail list. Mr. Daly asked the status of the animal shelter. The vehicles sit behind the building and don't get used. He said if the cars are not used the seal dries up. The Mayor said that a neighboring municipality is interested in buying them. In Closed Session a discussion will be held on the selling of the animal shelter. He said that the Clerk mentioned the Sentinel and we don't get it anymore. The Mayor said calls were made and they were bought out and they took us off everything. The Mayor said that we get a couple of copies here at the Borough and he can stop by and get a copy.

Santokh Singh, 28 North Shore Boulevard said he is interested in buying the liquor license and was told a discussion will take place during the Closed Session.

The Mayor said that the newsletter went out and in it is information about National Night Out and Helmetta Day. Representatives were invited to come and do a presentation but they declined. They will no longer be giving complimentary cards to the Spotswood children. They would like the Borough to enter into a shared service. It would cost the Borough between \$60,000.00 and \$80,000.00 or 1/3 of a million. Councilman Dzingleski said the next Concert will be on August 11th Councilwoman Carolan-Genthe said that they have appointed a new Principal for Memorial School, Mr. Brian Ketchen; Mrs. Torchiana will be the principal of Appleby and they are looking for a Principal at Schoenly. National Night Out will end with fireworks. The Board of Education will have a referendum question and voting will take place on September 26. There is money left over and they would like to reallocate approximately \$1.9 million. They had money leftover and there were items they did not put on. The State will give them a 40% match. They would like to use it for Memorial School security System and new doors, Appleby needs a new heating system and they need a backup generator. Councilman Reid said Helmetta Day will be September 23. The garden is up and running. One of the residents took the lead on it and she has stuff planted. ## SELF-EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Borough of Helmetta has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2017 budget year.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the governing body of the Borough of Helmetta that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.

- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
  - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
    - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
    - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
    - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
  - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.
